

SAPU Sexual Assault Prevention for Undergraduates

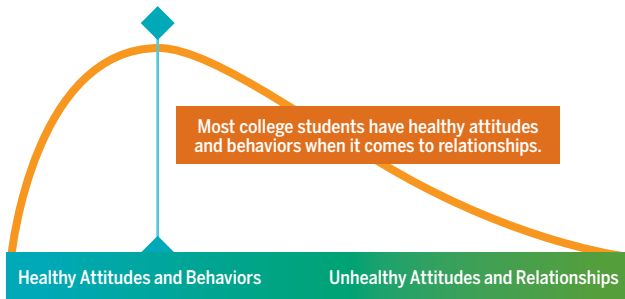
FOR INCOMING STUDENTS

- Increased understanding of school policies related to sexual assault and prevention
- Gave information about sexual consent that they plan to use

SAPU REINFORCES HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS

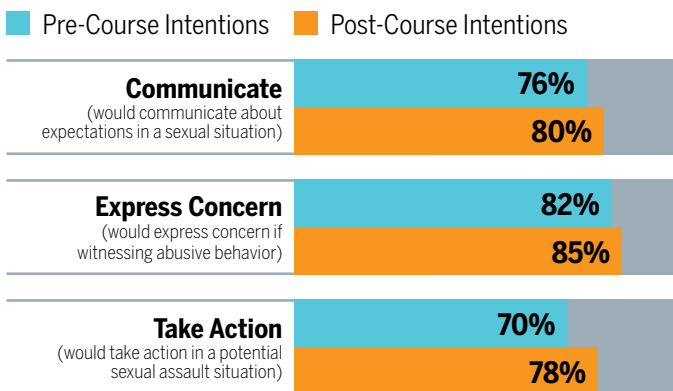


UT Austin is committed to creating a safe, caring campus community. SAPU provides students resources and skills on:

- Healthy communication and consent
- Recognizing abusive, concerning, or violent behavior
- Intervening when witnessing harmful behaviors
- Supporting survivors, including knowledge about campus resources and reporting

SAPU CREATES POSITIVE PEER NORMS

Perceptions of peer norms can influence behavior, as a person is more likely to act if they believe that they will be supported in that action by their community.



SAPU INCREASES KNOWLEDGE

After completing the course, students demonstrated increased knowledge about recognition of abusive behaviors, bystander intervention, resources, and reporting.
